Each has a unique life story but share many similar experiences. They were living in extreme poverty with little or no adult support or parenting. They were welcomed with life-saving food, shelter, and health care along with education, love, and guidance.

We drove to the home where she was living and found her sitting high up in a tree picking mangoes for her only sustenance. Shanty thrived at Bakhita Village and became a super-star student at St. Brendan's. She's the leader of the debate team, an altar-server at church, and a lead singer for all school and church occasions.

We recently received this note from Shanty: "When I lost my mom in grade 2, you took me in. I was helpless but you and the sisters fed me, clothed me, and cared for me. You have always stood by me. I just want to thank you. Even if I spoke a million tongues, it would not be enough to thank you."
